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Narrative of Achievements

Matthias P. Finger received a PhD in Education in 1986 and a PhD in Political Science in 1988 both from the University of Geneva, Switzerland. His career led him to be an Assistant Professor at Syracuse University, an Associate Professor at Columbia University, a Full Professor at the Swiss Graduate Institute of Public Administration and, in 2002, a Full Professor and Chair at the Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale Lausanne (EPFL) in Switzerland. He retired from EPFL in 2020 and continued as a part-time professor (10%) at the European University Institute in Florence, Italy (since 2010 until December 2025). Between 2018 and December 2025 he was an International Professor at Istanbul Technical University (ITÜ), Istanbul, Türkiye, where he directed the Istanbul Center for Regulation (IC4R). As of 2026 works as a part-time Professor at ITÜ, as a researcher and advisor at TENMAK, Türkiye's Energy, Nuclear and Minerals Research Agency, and as an advisor to World Energy Council Türkiye.

Areas of research, expertise and publication

- I have made my career in the field of the **network industries (energy, transport, communications, water)**, where I remain particularly interested in the co-evolution between institutions and technology, the regulation of the network industries as well as their governance more generally. I look at digital platforms as a new type of network industries, to which similar regulations could be applied (www.network-industries.org). In terms of geographical focus, I am mostly competent on Switzerland, Europe and Türkiye. I am the deputy Editor-in-Chief of the academic journal *Competition and Regulation in Network Industries* (Sage), having been the editor-in-chief between 2017 and 2023.
- I have a long-standing research interest in questions of **environment and development**, dating back to the beginning of my academic career. Concretely, I have co-created the so-called *GlobalArctic* project in 2014 while being at EPFL (www.globalarctic.org). The project is currently hosted by GCSP, the Geneva Center for Security Policy. As of 2025 I am directing a 42-months comprehensive research activity on energy and minerals in the Arctic, hosted by TENMAK, the Turkish Energy, Nuclear and Mineral Research Agency, in Ankara, Türkiye.
- I have developed, over the past ten years, an expertise in matters of **governance of large urban systems** including the role of digitalization in such governance (e.g., “smart cities”) (www.iglus.org). The program was accredited by EPFL between 2014 and 2022 and is no longer operating.
- My current research and advising focus is on issues of **global energy governance**.

Student advising

I have supervised and graduated 29 PhD students at EPFL and ITÜ, and accompanied numerous students in their internships and master theses.

Teaching

I have been teaching at EPFL between 2003 and 2020 masters (Corporate Governance; Industry Analysis) and PhD courses (Qualitative Research Methods; Industry Regulation) and have received the best teacher awards in 2011 and 2020. At ITÜ I have been teaching one course / year on the regulation of network industries.

The following four **MOOCs** (Massive Open Online Courses) are currently running:

- *Managing Urban Infrastructures*, online as of February 2016 (Coursera and EdX); so far over 35'000 students
- *Smart cities*, online February 2017 (Coursera and EdX); so far over almost 60'000 students

- *Innovative Governance of Large Urban Systems*, online as of February 2020 (Coursera); so far 6'000 students

Executive Education

I have been very active in Executive Education both as a teacher and as an organizer. During my career, I have developed and successfully conducted 4 executive education programs:

- Executive master in *Electronic Governance* accredited by EPFL, which was running between 2005 and 2011 (6 editions)
- Executive master in *Postal Management* accredited by EPFL, which was running between 2009 and 2011 (3 editions)
- Executive Certificate program on *Governing Energy Transition*, which was accredited by EPFL between 2017 and 2020 (4 editions); I have handed this program over to the University of St.Gallen, where it continues very successfully.
- In 2014 I have started a global Executive Masters Program on the *Innovative Governance of Large Urban Systems* (IGLUS; www.iglus.org). This program was accredited by EPFL and ran through 8 editions until 2020, when it stopped operating as a result of COVID-19 which made travelling impossible. The last students graduated in 2022 and the program was subsequently closed.

Organization of stakeholder forums

I have created the *Florence School of Regulation – Transport Area* at the European University Institute (EUI) in 2010 and have successfully conducted over 70 stakeholder forums on regulatory policies for the broader transport area together with the European Commission (DG MOVE). I have handed its directorship over to my successor, Prof. Juan Montero, in 2023 and have retired from EUI at the end of December 2025.

Between June 2022 and June 2024, I was president of *Avenir Mobilité*, a membership organization that organizes high-level policy dialogues involving all relevant stakeholders about the future of mobility in Switzerland.

Service

At an academic level, I have been serving and continue to serve in numerous ways, most notably as:

- I was an editor-in-Chief of the international academic journal *Competition and Regulation in Network Industries* (SAGE) between 2017 and 2023 and now serve as the Deputy Editor-in-Chief.
- I was the Editor-in-Chief of the online journal *Network Industries Quarterly* (NIQ) since its inception in 1998 until December 2025, when I handed NIQ over to Prof. Juan Montero at the EUI.
- I have been a member of several editorial boards, the most important ones being Utilities Policy (Elsevier), *Sosyoekonomi* (Journal of Economics and Administrative Sciences), *Zeitschrift für Verkehrswissenschaft*, *Annals of Public and Cooperative Economics*, *Journal Transformational Learning*, and *Global Environmental Politics*.

At a professional level, I have been serving as a member of the Swiss Railway regulator (**RailCom**) between 2004 and 2015, as well as a member of the Swiss Federal Electricity regulator (**ElCom**) between 2007 and 2019.

At EPFL I have served as the Dean of Executive Education between 2003 and 2008.
